

# LISTEN TO THE WORD

12TH JANUARY 2025 - BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11 Psalm 103 Titus 2: 11-14, 3: 4-7 Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22

Baptism is a sacrament; it is a meeting place, a holy place, where we come face to face with God. In Baptism we are named, we are placed into the arms of God and become known to Him in a very special way. We receive a special gift, the Holy Spirit, a companion on our life journey. As we grow, the Spirit, given to us in the sacrament, grows with us and we have the choice whether to use the gift or to let it lie, dormant, until, perhaps on a future day, our hearts are awakened by God's call.

The people of the Old Testament were forever searching for God. In today's passage from Isaiah he acknowledges that the search has been long and difficult. He speaks of a time when a highway will be made straight in the desert, when valleys are lifted up, and mountains laid low so that "the glory of the Lord shall be revealed. He speaks of the Lord as a shepherd tenderly caring for his flock and gathering the lambs in his arms.

In Paul's time Baptism involved a great leap of faith, it was a lifelong commitment, often involving danger and martyrdom. Paul announces that "The grace of God has appeared", that it is time to renounce our previous faults and begin a new life washed clean by the sacrament and filled by the Holy Spirit "whom he poured on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior". The way we follow leads to the hope of eternal life.

There was great excitement when John appeared in the wilderness announcing the water of repentance. People flocked to him in the hope that he was the Messiah; but he denied this, promising only that another was among them and that, whilst John baptised with water, he would baptise "with the Holy Spirit and fire". Luke describes in epic language the descent of the Holy Spirit and the voice of God. Jesus was at prayer; he would have been aware of the noises surrounding him as John continued to baptise the people. Did Jesus have a sudden revelation that this was a special moment? From this moment the mission of Our Lord begins, His heart is awakened by the Father's call, and everything changes. The journey begins.

#### A Prayer based on Psalm 104

"You send forth your spirit, and they are created, and you renew the face of the earth"

Lord,

Thank you for the gift of Baptism.

When we first come into your presence you bless our name and invite us to be your children.

You wash us with the waters of salvation and anoint us as priest, prophet and king making us great in your sight.

And you set over us your Holy Spirit to guide us through the trials and joys of life until we are welcomed once again into your presence.

For this we give you thanks. Amen.

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries:

'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.'

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Saviour appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Saviour, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.
