Please remember to switch off your mobile phone (or put it on silent) when coming into Church.



LISTEN TO THE WORD 22ND JUNE 2025 - TRINITY SUNDAY Genesis 14: 18-20 | Psalm 109 | 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26 | Luke 9: 11-17

Today's readings may appear to be very brief: a few short lines from Genesis, a familiar passage from Paul to the Corinthians and a miracle story from Luke's Gospel. But beneath the brevity of the words there is a great treasure of understanding. I find it amazing that the simple meal of bread and wine so familiar from the Last Supper passage begins, thousands of years earlier, with Melchizedek and Abraham. Then Paul, in the midst of admonishing the people of Corinth for their lack of respect to the church and one another, takes time to remind them of the central core of their faith: the New Covenant, the Eucharist and the second coming of Christ.

The miracle of the loaves and fishes reminds me that wherever two or three are gathered Jesus promises to be with us, whether in a great cathedral, in a field with thousands of people or a humble chapel with a small group of believers. The Eucharist is there; for us the bread of life, and, for the world, a reminder of Christ's love for all humanity.

I believe that a church is never empty. It is filled by the memories and the love of all who have worshipped there. When we leave our family and friends before the altar of God for that final parting, something of their spirit remains. We can never feel alone in our seats because we are in the presence of God's love, and all who return to Him become part of that love. Coming to Mass or a Service of the Word and Holy Communion can sometimes be difficult, for there are many calls upon our time, but if we see these opportunities as real family gatherings - of old and young, of those who are always with us - then it becomes, each time, a new celebration, one at which the King of Love requests our presence.

Let us share a vision:

And as I raised the Lamb of God, I saw a wondrous sight For in the dark and empty church, I saw a sea of light

And every seat was taken, by a smiling joyful throng And the very stones were shaking, as they joined in heavenly song

And I knew their names and faces, for they were friends of mine Long gone but not forgotten, outside of space and time.

Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

But he said to them, 'You give them something to eat.' They said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish — unless we are to go and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. And he said to his disciples, 'Make them sit down in groups of about fifty each.' And they did so, and made them all sit down. And taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and said a blessing over them. Then he broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. And they all ate and were satisfied. And what was left over was picked up, twelve baskets of broken pieces.

The Executive Board of Bishop Wilkinson Catholic Education Trust, in partnership with the Local Governing Committee of St Patrick's Catholic Primary School, are proposing a change to the age range of the school from 4-11 to 3-11. As part of the process, we would like to hear your views on the proposal. Currently, children who join St Patrick's at the age of 4, come from a variety of settings within the locality. Under the new proposals, children aged 3 upwards would be able to formally become part of the same structure as the school within a new early years unit.

Responses will be received throughout the consultation period, which begins on Monday 2nd June at 12 noon and ends on Monday 23rd June at 12 noon.
