Advent is a time for welcoming. Each year around this time we welcome family and friends into our homes and into our hearts; sometimes the visit is brief, sometimes only a card sending best wishes for Christmas and sometimes they join with us to celebrate with a feast on Christmas day. These days are special.

I heard a sermon the other day and the priest spoke to us about two Christmases: one the birth of Christ and the other the feast we celebrate this year. It is important to remind ourselves of the separate nature of these two events. The first Christmas was a single event in time, a momentous event which can never be repeated, for God became man on that day over two thousand years ago and changed humanity forever. Next week we celebrate that event, but we do so in our own time and place. Sometimes we confuse the birth of our Lord with all the hype of a modern Christmas: however, we cannot make the birth of Christ come alive unless we bring it into our homes on Christmas day.

When Jesus was born the world was very different; most of the known world was ruled by the Roman Empire. There was no mass media, no earth encompassing technology. People struggled to find out what was happening in the next village never mind somewhere on the far side of the world. Today all manner of things are within our grasp. We cannot see Christmas and miss the suffering in our world; we cannot pretend there is peace on earth when it is not so. We must celebrate the love that Jesus revealed to us by his birth, life, death and resurrection but with modern eyes mindful of the needs of his world today.

The message of each of today's readings is summed up by Isaiah:

‘Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son; and shall call his name Emmanuel’
- a name which means ‘God is with us’.

It is important to remember that Mary's son, Jesus Christ, the Son of God is with us every day and in a special way this week when we celebrate his birth. Let us pray that He will guide us on the path to peace and justice for all his creation.

Amen.

In those days: The LORD spoke to Ahaz: ‘Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven.’ But Ahaz said, ‘I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test.’ And Isaiah said, ‘Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Emmanuel.’

Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel — which means, God with us.

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to send her away quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, ‘Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for

he will save his people from their sins.’
All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:

‘Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son,
and they shall call his name Emmanuel’ —
which means, God with us.

When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife.
